

I recently came across the 2014 ad Run Like a Girl, and was surprised by how much it annoyed me. The ad was created by the menstrual brand Always, and explores the concept of doing things "like a girl". There were two age groups in the ad, teenagers and pre-teens.

When requested to run like a girl, the teens (picture above, in a still from the ad) acted silly, while the pre-teens ran with enthusiasm and a desire to do their best. The subtext was that somewhere around puberty girls stop putting their best selves forward and put forward a

lesser version that they think society wants to see.

Procter & Gamble was inspired to make the ad after discovering the brand's objective of empowering girls via puberty wasn't clear to young customers. The campaign was based on a social experiment to demonstrate the effects of the term "like a girl" on females before and during puberty.

Speaking from a personal level, throughout my 14 years, I have spent at least a third of my life worrying about earning the respect of other people. Since entering adolescence, I have experienced

intense body angst and felt neither deserving of the title "girl" nor anywhere close to the identity of "woman". Everything I was and wasn't, was determined by people's opinions or preferences. I wasn't willowy, but I was tall. Tanned but not flawless. I wasn't slim, but I was strong. Biologically speaking, a human, not a woman.

I'm part of the 49.58% of people born female. I will in fact swim like a girl, fight like a girl and run like a girl because I am a girl. The "like a girl" concept infuriates me, but I refuse to be one of the teens who doesn't put the best version of myself forward.

One thing I want girls everywhere to know is that if someone tells you that you run like a girl, be proud of it. It means to run as fast as you can. To do something like a girl is to do it to the best of your ability. Have the mentality that it's normal to do things like a girl and show the world how great you can be.

On the 8th of November, Australia witnessed a total lunar eclipse. People across the country stepped outside of their houses, and peaked through their windows to witness this breath-taking event. The eclipse had an overall duration of 5 hours and 54 minutes, making it the longest in 580 years!

The duration of totally of the eclipse, (when the moon

appeared to be fully red moving through the Earth's shadow) was 1 hour and 25 minutes.

Although a total eclipse was viewed from Australia last year, from now until 2025 there will not be a total lunar eclipse, only practical or penumbral. Other areas that could view this eclipse were Asia, North America, parts of northern and eastern Europe, and the majority of South America.

# Bill to protect the intersex

According to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, about 3.2% of the Australian population is intersex.

Human Rights Australia defines intersex people as "having innate [genetic, hormonal or physical] sex characteristics that don't fit medical and social norms for female or male bodies, and that create risks or experiences of stigma, discrimination and harm."

Earlier this year, intersex advocates

and LGBTIQ+ groups welcomed the ACT government's introduction of draft legislation that aims to prevent harmful medical interventions on intersex people of all ages without their personal consent.

If passed, the bill would ban deferrable medical interventions on children with intersex traits until they're old enough to decide treatments for themselves. There will be exceptions for emergency and urgently necessary procedures.

## Cody shares their intersex story



Four days after the ACT government introduced draft legislation to prevent harmful medical interventions on intersex people, the ABC News spoke to Cody Smith [They/Them]. This is an excerpt from the ABC article.

"[When] I was born, I was almost immediately taken away [by] doctors - they pushed for surgery and my parents agreed to have some of those intersex traits surgically corrected with a number of [procedures] during the first two years of my life.

"When doctors have picked a gender for you, you're raised in that gender. There were decisions that were made for me that should have been my decisions. I think making hormonal changes to induce behaviours of growth, because it's seen as being normalising, doesn't help and makes things worse."




## **Delaney-Cordelai, Admiral**

"Delaney-Cordelai is the design for an original Dungeons and Dragons character. I had a lot of fun designing their costume and overall appearance."




